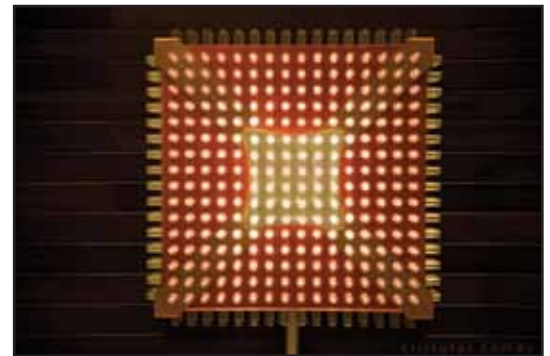

INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN ARTIST, KRISTOFER LAMEY



Join Art Partners for a tour of artist Kristofer Lamey's studio, which is housed in his spectacular Peters Street loft in Castleberry Hill. The loft was originally a machine shop and is now a beautiful and intriguing home.

Kristofer considers himself an industrial designer. Though the skill set he employs categorizes him as such, what makes him different is the fact that the works he produces each year are sold as art. He creates one-of-a-kind works of art generated through industrial design, using glass, metal, and light. Each individual work is specifically designed to fit the client's space and personality.

The creation of each piece combines a delicate balance of hand and machine, and it is not uncommon for the materials to be fitted into place within a space the width of a human hair. He begins by imagining a form and designs from the inside out—logically built and emotionally expressed. From concept to completion each piece requires a time frame of anywhere from two to nine months.

Lamey's pieces generally sell for \$20,000 to \$90,000 each. Around seven people are involved in the creative process and only three to five pieces are made per year. Lamey's work is sold in the United States and in Paris. Though an integral part of his marketing is focused outside the United States, Atlanta is Lamey's home, both personally and professionally, and his artwork is an indigenous product of the southeastern United States. The process of fabricating the work and all the people involved are here in Atlanta. As such, Lamey wants people to know international quality can be found locally. ■

CONTEMPORARY JAPANESE PRINTS

Walking through the East Cobb home of Jerry & Anne Godsey is a journey through the markets, antique shops, and museums of Asia. The Godseys lived in the Far East for nearly 27 years, including the countries of Japan, Singapore, Indonesia and Macau. During their Asian sojourn and extensive travels, they collected a diverse assortment of prints, porcelains, textiles, furniture, lacquerware, baskets, betel nut boxes, silver and handicrafts.

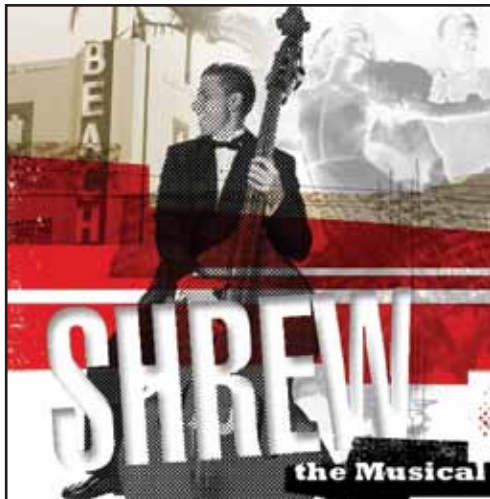
Art Partners will have the special opportunity to tour the Godsey's collection of original, limited edition contemporary Japanese prints. Their collection consists of more than 400 original prints by 75 different Japanese artists, with approximately 160 prints framed and hanging. The printing techniques represented include woodblock, silk-screen, lithograph, and etching by such artists as Tadashi Nakayama, Joiichi Hoshi, Sadao Watanabe, Toko Shinoda, Haku Maki, Reika Iwami, Yoshitoshi Mori, Tetsuo Sawada, Clifton Karhu, Kiyoshi Saito, and Kazutoshi Sugiura. Many of these artists were productive during the 1960-1980s, although a few are still printing today. Listed in the 1980 edition of *Who's Who in American Art*, the Godsey collection of original contemporary Japanese prints has been displayed at Callanwolde, Oglethorpe University Museum, Handshake Gallery, the Marcus Jewish Community Center, and the Elliott Art Museum in Stuart, Florida. ■

SHREW: THE MUSICAL

You won't want to miss this performance of *Shrew: The Musical* by Georgia Shakespeare at Oglethorpe. This adaptation of *The Taming of the Shrew* is set in 1930s Palm Beach, with Petrucchio and Kate singing, dancing and matching wits like Fred and Ginger. The AJC said on June 18, "When a dancer from Manhattan parachutes into Miami during the height of art-deco glamour, he doesn't just land on his feet. He arrives tap dancing, a clue that this musical take on Shakespeare's *The Taming of the Shrew* is going to be a giddy Valentine to the frothy song-and-dance revues of Broadway's Jazz Age. The night dances by all too quickly."

The performance will be held in Oglethorpe's state-of-the-art theatre at 2:00 p.m. and you can enjoy a picnic beforehand on the covered and shaded terrace where Art Partners will have a reserved table beginning at 12:30 p.m. Bring a basket and your favorite bottle of wine. 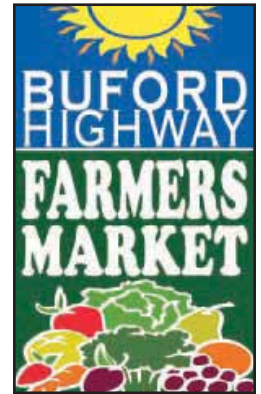
